



Last month, December 29 marked 69 years for our community. Community Associations play an integral role – convening and building community while sharing ideas to improve our quality of life.

In 2022, the PCA delivered excellent programs and services to our community, including:

The Youth Soccer Program provided an outdoor experience for our children. Drills and games kept our youth busy over the spring months. Thank you to all the parent volunteers that make this program so successful.

Our well-subscribed Garden Program continued to blossom, including the return of the Parkdale Garden Tour on June 25 and the Harvest Dinner on October 16.

On December 6, the PCA and Level Playing Field received the 2022 Accessibility Award for Universal Design from City Council for improving access for persons with disabilities in Calgary. This award was in recognition for the design-construction of our Accessible Outdoor Rink.

Once again, the PCA and Parkdale Nifty fifties teamed up with the CBC Holiday Food Drive and offered our facility as a drop off location for food donations.

Our last PCA event of the year was our annual Kids Holiday Party on December 3.

A very big thank you to our board, committees, staff, and volunteers for making 2022 a great year!

As we start the new year, the PCA is looking forward to celebrating our first birthday of the Parkdale Accessible Community Outdoor Rink. Membership Renewal

A new year is a time for renewal - dusting off and renewing your resolutions from 2022 (how successful were you in completing them?); renewing your resolution to exercise more and eat healthy; and perhaps, renewing your commitment to become more engaged with your neighbours and community. After all, knowing your neighbours and being an active participant in your community makes for a safer, more desirable, and fun community—a community that you can be proud of. And that is what the Parkdale Community Association (PCA) is striving for. You can do your part by joining the PCA for the first time or renewing your annual membership.

Your PCA membership helps to bring you programs and events such as the accessible rink and hub, youth soccer program, community garden, Family Day celebration, Stampede Breakfast, voting at the PCA's the Annual General Meeting, and so much more. Your current PCA membership expires on January 31, 2023, unless you renewed or became a member in November or December of 2022 (those will expire on January 31, 2024). The PCA membership year is from February 1 to January 31.

The annual family membership is \$31.50. Individuals pay \$21 per year, and seniors (ages 65 and older) pay just \$5.25 per senior. The annual membership for businesses and organizations is \$52.50 per year.

SAFE & SOUND

Sledding Safety

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and children about a few toboggan/sledding safety tips as the winter season continues. Injuries may result from collisions with stationary objects on the hill, such as trees, poles, rocks, or even collisions with other people. Unprotected falls can also result in more serious injury if you lose control at high speeds. However, everyone can be safe and have fun on the toboggan hill by following these reminders.

Equipment


- Always ensure your toboggan, or sledding device, is in good repair. Inspect it for any damaged or missing parts before each use.
- Be certain the operator is fully capable of staying in control of the sled at all times.
- Wear a ski helmet, designed for use in cold weather and high speeds.

Hazards

- Avoid hills that are too steep or too icy.
- Choose hills free of all obstacles such as trees, rocks, utility poles, benches, or fences.
- Beware of loose scarves, or clothing containing drawstrings, which could present a strangulation hazard if they become caught or snagged.
- Look out for others. Move quickly to the side after finishing a run and stay to the side of the sliding path when walking up the hill.
- Children should be supervised by an adult; never toboggan alone.
- Tobogganing at night is not advised.

Plan Ahead

- Dress warmly in layers and anticipate weather changes.
- Consider bringing extra sets of gloves and toques to exchange wet garments for dry ones.
- Take breaks out of the cold to warm up.
- · Attempt to cover any exposed skin.
- Even when properly protected from the elements, the fingertips, toes, ears, the tip of the nose, and other high points on the face, such as the forehead and cheek bones can be affected by frostbite.
- If frost bite has occurred, treat it by first removing the individual out of the cold environment. Gently warm the affected skin by placing a warm hand over it, or by placing the affected part in warm - not hot - water, until re-warmed.

As we bid farewell to 2022 and ring in the new year, affordability remains one of the primary challenges facing Canadians.
