Spicy Chicken Curry

Spice it up! Spices improve the natural flavour and appearance of food. There are over 300 spices but the most popular are Black pepper, Mustard, Cumin, Turmeric, Cloves, and Cinnamon.



Spices have been used for centuries for their medicinal and preservative qualities. In addition to their antibacterial and antifungal properties they are also a good source of vitamins, calcium, iron and antioxidants.

Saffron often referred to as "red gold" is the most expensive spice in the world and because of its distinctive yellow colour is used in everything from liquor, cheeses, curries, meat and rice dishes and soups.

Generally used in small amounts spices are probably the easiest way to create a great tasting meal.

Prep Time: 15 minutes **Cook Time:** 40 minutes

Servings: 5 to 6

Ingredients:

- · 3 lbs boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 2 small onions finely sliced
- 34 cup Canola oil
- 1 ½ tbsps minced ginger
- 1 ½ tbsps minced garlic
- 3 tbsps curry powder
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp ground turmeric
- 1 ½ tsps powdered red chilli peppers
- 2 bay leaves
- 1.5 tsps salt
- 1 cup plain yoghurt
- 1/2 can (398 ml) crushed tomatoes
- 1 ½ cups water
- 1 tsp sugar
- ¾ cup coconut milk
- 1 ½ tsp Garam Masala
- 3 to 4 tbsps chopped cilantro

Directions:

- Cut chicken breasts into bite size pieces. Heat oil in a large pot or skillet, add onions and sauté until onions are lightly brown. Add ginger and garlic and sauté for a minute then add chicken and continue sautéing until the chicken is no longer pink on the outside about two to four minutes.
- Add curry powder, cumin, turmeric, red chilli peppers and the bay leaves and stir fry for two to three minutes.
 If the mixture is sticking to the pot sprinkle a little water and reduce heat.
- Next add the yoghurt and blend in followed by the water. Cover the pot and allow the curry to simmer for approximately 15 to 20 minutes or until chicken is tender.
- You can now add the crushed tomatoes, sugar and coconut milk and simmer for two to three minutes.
- Remove the curry from the heat and garnish with garam masala and chopped coriander leaves.
- Serve Spicy Chicken Curry with a tossed salad, steamed rice or naan bread.



Dear Constituents,

Parliament has been back in session for a little over a month now and continuing from my work in 2023, I immediately delved back into the ArriveCan study. As Conservative Shadow Minister for Treasury Board, I've been leading the charge to get answers for Canadians as to why the app ended up costing \$54 million dollars. Conservatives will continue fighting for accountability and answers from this Liberal government.

Last month, my office continued our annual tradition of delivering Valentines for Seniors in our community of Calgary Midnapore. Thank you to the staff and students at Don Bosco School in Deer Ridge for the beautiful handmade cards! My staff had a great time delivering them to over 100 residents at the Atria – Canyon Meadows retirement facility.

On April 1, Justin Trudeau will be signing off on two tax increases. The Carbon Tax will shoot up to \$80 per tonne, and with this Canadians can expect to see a rise in the cost of everything from gas and heat to groceries. As if one tax increase isn't bad enough, the Liberal governments escalator tax on beer, wine, and spirits will rise by 4.7% at the start of April as well. Since the escalator tax was introduced in 2017 overall taxes on alcohol have increased by a staggering 19%. Alongside my Conservative colleagues, I've been relentless in calling on this government to axe the carbon tax and bring home lower prices for all Canadians.

Childcare and affordability are crucial for families and the government recognizes this. That is why in 2021 the Alberta government signed the Canada-Alberta Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement. The government believes that all Albertans deserve an affordable, accessible, high-quality, inclusive childcare sector.

To help both families and businesses, the creation of the Early Learning and Child Care Agreement promises a total of \$3.8 billion being invested over five years to bring childcare fees to an average of \$10 per day. Having affordable childcare is what creates opportunities and keeps money in parents' pockets.

Since January 2022, childcare fees that were paid by parents were reduced by 50% across Alberta. In 2024, it is expected that parents will pay an average of \$15 a day and by 2026 that average will be reduced to \$10 a day. In addition, the Alberta government is excited to announce that it has put over \$900 million back into the pockets of parents who use childcare. That is approximately \$550 per month per child. Furthermore, just in 2024 alone the Child Care Agreement will save families in Alberta \$9,000 per year per child.

Supporting Childcare Staff and Operators - Affordability Grant

In order to support both operators and reduce parental fees for childcare, the Alberta government has replaced revenue operators with the Affordability Grants. What is exciting about these grants is that while the fees paid by parents are decreasing, childcare operators have seen an increase in their total revenue from the government, plus an additional amount in recognition of increased costs. In total, most operators have seen an increase of 9% in total program fees over the past three years. The Alberta government is also offering other funding that will support the staff of childcare facilities. These include wage top ups for early educator staff, of up to \$8.62 per hour, and access to \$4,300 per educator per year for professional development and training. These efforts from the Alberta government have and continue to make a difference in the lives of many Albertans.


