PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hello Fairviewers!

We are getting closer to the end of 2023 and the FCA board has lots of fun programs and events in store, even in the winter!

In October we had our casino night, which is our main fundraiser for community events, programs, and projects. We also had a chance in October to attend open houses for future developments around Fairview, including Midtown Station and Heritage Plaza (more information can be found on our website at fairviewcommunity.ca/planning). The FCA board also established a Development and Planning Committee to help share information with Fairviewers on important development projects and provide feedback to developers and city planners.

We hosted the City of Calgary's Mobile Adventure Playground in Fairview Park in November, and Bowling with Santa takes place December 10. Our holiday elves (volunteers) will also return this year to observe the "festiveness" of each street in Fairview in mid-December (date subject to weather conditions). The elves will be checking for holiday lights and decorations, so be sure to light up the night for bragging rights as the most festive street in Fairview!

Winter weather also means the return of our outdoor rink at Flavelle Park. The dates for setting up and for skating are weather-dependent. Our 2023-24 rinkmaster (Jason) and our previous rinkmaster (Wayne) have outlined some of the tasks that go into our awesome outdoor rink. You can find more details in this newsletter. We continue to see the evolution of the Sparking Lot in Fairview Park. At the end of October, our outdoor ping pong table was delivered! The community association has left a few paddles and balls on site - please leave the equipment as you found it for others to enjoy. After going through the development permit process with the City of Calgary, our storage space was delivered and put on site. The sea can will be painted in the spring of 2024, when the weather permits. This is an exciting milestone, since it will allow us to store things like our rink boards, etc. in a secure space and in the spring will be the hub for activities and events taking place in the Sparking Lot.

The FCA board is volunteer-based, and each member has a passion for contributing to their community. Behind every event, newsletter article, grant application, and meeting, is a crew of amazing volunteers. Flavelle Park Outdoor Rink Update

Hello Fairview!

We are gearing up for a great year of skating at Flavelle Park! Usually, we try to get the rink built and flooded in the first part of December to have it ready for skating during the holiday break. It takes volunteers to make this happen each year!

Below we've outlined the different tasks required throughout the season. If any jump out at you as something that you would be able to help with, please contact Jason at rink@fairviewcommunity.ca. We'll also post a call for volunteers on our social media pages (Instagram and Facebook @fairviewyyc) since we have to wait for the weather to cooperate.

Also please note that all ages are welcome. If any teenagers are looking for volunteer hours for resumes or life experience, we're happy to have them help out.

Build/Set-Up

Timeline: Early December (or whenever the snow and ice stops melting on the roads)

This task requires as many people as we can get working together to get the rink area built. No experience is required, just hands to move things around and put the boards together.

Flooding

Timeline: We have a water truck that delivers water for the initial flood, and then periodically during the season. Sometimes it's during the day, but most often it is in the early evening.

Not much work is required other than to assist the truck where needed and monitor the boards and tarp, to make sure things are in order.

Maintenance

Timeline: Throughout the season, we monitor holes and other issues with the ice, as well as the rink area in general.

While the rink isn't being used, you can use hot water and snow to make slush and fill in any holes in the ice.

For general cleanup of the rink area, we ask that everyone keeps an eye out for lost items, damage, litter, etc. so we can make the rink a better experience for all.



Take-Down

Timeline: At the end of the season, we all have a big cry because we will miss the rink, and we take the rink apart.

A large group helps to disassemble, load into trucks, and store at our brand-new storage sea can located at Fairview Park.

Events

We are considering a Winter Festival party in 2024, to get the community together. If you are interested in helping out, please reach out.

Cold Weather Preparations

Alberta winters can be bitterly cold and when the temperature dips below -40 degrees Celsius, that's when "extreme cold warnings" occur. Wind gusts can be strong enough in our province to make it feel even colder.

It's Important to Remember a Few Things During Extreme Cold Warnings:

Try to Stay Indoors

Roads and other paved surfaces can be snowy or icy during extreme cold warnings. If you must go out, always let someone know where you are going and follow these instructions:

- Check 511.Alberta.ca, Environment Canada, or download the WeatherCAN or AEA Alert app for current road conditions or emergency alerts.
- Try to cover as much exposed skin as possible. Wear warm, waterproof, and windproof layers, scarves, neck warmers, or protective face liners and waterproof footwear.
- If you are sweating, remove outer layers of clothing or open your coat to avoid getting your clothes wet.

Learn how to prepare a vehicle emergency kit if you must drive.

Be Careful!

Some people are more susceptible to the cold, particularly children, older adults, those with circulation issues, those experiencing unstable housing, or those outdoors for long periods of time.

Being cold over a long period of time or being exposed to cold air, water, wind, or rain, can cause a drop in body temperature and, in some serious cases, can cause hypothermia.

What Is Hypothermia?

Hypothermia occurs when the body gets cold and loses heat faster than the body can make it. A body temperature below normal can be a sign of hypothermia and can cause shivering, confusion, and loss of muscular control (e.g., difficulty walking). It can progress to a life-threatening condition.

If you think someone has hypothermia:

- Call 9-1-1 to get medical attention immediately.
- Lay the person down and avoid rough handling, particularly if the person is unconscious.
- Get the person indoors.
- Gently remove wet clothing.
- Warm the person gradually and slowly, using available sources of heat.
- Protect the person from further heat loss/eliminate contact with cold surfaces.

If someone has symptoms of extreme cold, such as hypothermia, please seek immediate medical attention.


Support Is Available

If you work outside during an extreme cold warning, consider taking warm-up breaks or rescheduling your work if possible. Your employer may have options available to help you avoid being in the cold for too long.
