



The Buzz on Calgary Bumble Bees Thursday, May 11, 7:00 to 8:30 pm

Presented by Syd Cannings, Biologist, Canadian Wildlife Service, Prairie Region Environment and Climate Change Canada

Bumble bee populations pose a conservation concern these days, and several species from the Calgary area have been assessed as at risk by the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada. This talk will provide an introduction to bumble bees and their basic biology, examine bees whose numbers have declined, the reasons for the decline, and what we can do about the situation. Syd Cannings is a Species at Risk Biologist with the Canadian Wildlife Service in Whitehorse, Yukon. He is a member of COSEWIC, the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada, and has led the development of the national recovery strategies and management plans for four species of bumble bees. He has also written several books, including British Columbia: A Natural History, and The New BC Roadside Naturalist. To register, visit https://friendsoffishcreek. org/event/buzz.

Happy Victoria Day!



Victoria Day, held each year on the last Monday proceeding May 24, is a long weekend in Canada and the start of the summer season across the country.

The day is held in honour of British monarch Queen Victoria.

This queen had deep ties with Canada, and her father, Prince Edward, Duke of Kent and Strathearn (1767 to 1820) had a role in the eventual formation of Canada as a country. The province of Prince Edward Island is named after him.

For many Canadians, Victoria Day marks the unofficial beginning of summer, with many people opening their summer cabins. It is a popular holiday as it is the first holiday to take place in the warmer summer months.

Did You Know?

- Victoria Day is a Canadian tradition and doesn't actually exist in most of England. But it is celebrated in parts of Scotland, especially Edinburgh, where it remains an official holiday.
- When Victoria was just a little girl, she was known by her nickname, Drina.
- Despite being born in England, Victoria only spoke German up until the age of three.
- She married Prince Albert in 1840, although they'd known each other since she was 16; and it really was a family affair. Prince Albert of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha was her first cousin, and his father was her mother's brother!
- Because she was Queen, she had to propose to Albert, and not vice versa.
- She took over the throne in 1837, after the death of William IV. She was just 18 years old.

- Despite the somewhat imposing figure she's been portrayed as in history, the real Victoria didn't completely measure up. She stood just five feet tall.
- She was the subject of at least six serious assassination attempts.
- When you see pictures or actresses playing Victoria, she's almost always wearing black. That's because when her husband died in December 1861, she went into seclusion and a perpetual state of mourning and never wore any other colour.
- She became a grandma at 39 and a great grandmother twenty years later.
- The mother of nine suffered one of the major drawbacks of such a long life, tragically outliving three of her own children.

This year, Emergency Preparedness Week runs from May 7 to 13. This is an annual event that takes place across Canada every May.

During Emergency Preparedness Week, The City encourages Calgarians to take actions to prepare and protect themselves, their families, and their homes during an emergency event.

Know the Risks: Learn about the types of disasters and hazards that can occur in Calgary.

Get Prepared: Every emergency is different but having a plan will help you and your family know what to do and who to contact in different situations. Get prepared by reviewing your insurance coverage, practicing a home evacuation, and taking steps to protect your home. A fillable emergency action plan is available in various translated languages at calgary.ca/getready, along with tips to get prepared.

Know What to Do During an Emergency: It's important to stay informed by monitoring local TV, radio, and emergency alerts.

Know What to Expect After an Emergency: Cleaning up after a disaster can be hazardous. Ensure that you only enter a disaster site when it's safe and with the proper protective equipment. Remember to document all damages and contact your insurance provider as soon as possible.

Hen-Keeping is Even More Than it's Cracked Up to Be

from the City of Calgary



To Chris Huston, a City of Calgary employee, henkeeping started as an interest in sustainability that developed into a passion for animals, his community, and cooking. "Each one of the hens has its own distinct personality," he said with a smile.

Huston participated in Calgary's urban hen-keeping pilot program last year and has made countless omelettes since last spring. "Collecting the eggs from the nests will never get old. We even invite the neighbours and their kids to visit the chickens and feed them," said Huston.

Before Huston built his coop, he talked to his neighbours; they were concerned they'd be woken first thing by a rooster. That is a common misconception about henkeeping, but roosters are not permitted under the Responsible Pet Ownership bylaw, meaning nobody will be subjected to early morning 'cock-a-doodle-doos' because hens are female chickens, and they are more polite neighbours than roosters.

Aside from producing eggs, Huston's hens, Tia and Tamera, have kept him busy with their home renovations: Pollo Palace, his coop, has had many additions since it was initially built. "I know my place in the pecking order," Huston joked. While his tone is jovial, the point is clear: hen-keeping is an ongoing responsibility that requires your attention and effort to keep them happy and safe.

If you're interested in hen-keeping, the City of Calgary is re-opening the program this year, and an unlimited number of licences are available from spring to fall. Visit us at calgary.ca/pets/licences/urban-hens to learn more.

Love Where You Live: Host a Block Party!

A Message from the Federation of Calgary Communities

Summer is almost here! What better way to kick off the season than to host a block party? Whether you want to get to know your neighbours, celebrate your community, discover something new about the area, or just have a good time, look no further!

There is no better way to get to know your neighbours than to have a block party. Neighbourhood block parties can develop relationships among neighbours, which creates a strong sense of community and a safer place to live. Block parties provide an opportunity for neighbourhood residents to get to know one another, have some fun, and mingle! A connected neighbourhood can create a sense of pride, safety, and cohesion for all who live there. Neighbours who know each other can look out for one another and create a safer community.

A block party isn't just about gathering people together on a street; it's about bringing a community together. Block parties offer the rare opportunity to bring a sense of small-town life into Calgary. Block parties don't have to happen on a road or a street; they can happen anywhere that brings neighbours together.

Let us help you throw the best block party that Calgary's ever seen! All you'll need to do is follow these steps:

- **1. Put together your party planning committee.** It may seem like a daunting task, but planning a block party is easier that it seems especially with a good group of neighbours working together! It's best to begin this step at least two months before the date of your event to leave time for planning, petitioning, and permits.
- 2. As soon as possible, get out there and get your petition signed by all affected neighbours! This is an important step that must be completed early in the process. The following information should be indicated on the petition:
 - a. Date of the party/activity.
 - b. Address of the party/activity.

- c. Names and addresses of all affected residents within the block area.
- d. One adult signature from each household either accepting or rejecting the block party/street activity. If rejected, obtain a brief statement explaining why so that consideration may be given by approving authorities on the applicant's request.
- e. Whether the resident owns or rents the property within the block area.
- f. Home and business telephone number of the applicant.
- g. Map showing closure of road for the block party/ activity.

3. Apply for a Block Party and Play Street Permit with the City of Calgary.


Cost: Free

Timeline: Minimum of 15 business days with completed petition

- **4. Put your idea together.** Think of the fun, different things you can do! Your block party could follow any number of themes: a BBQ, potluck, catered meal, picnic, garden tour, cultural gathering, water park, or historical walk. Will you have games? Live music? An outdoor movie? A talent show? The options are endless for what a block party could be. Have fun with mixing and matching ideas!
- 5. Let's talk logistics! A crucial step in bringing your block party to life is planning the logistics. Here are a few things for you to think about:

Parties cost money! How are you planning to pay for your block party? Neighbours can chip in for the party, but also consider reaching out for donations/ sponsorships from local companies to cut costs on food and entertainment! Be sure to check for any grants or funding opportunities you may be eligible for. Otherwise, you could hold a local bottle drive or a community garage sale to help fundraise for your block party!

Will you need tables/seating? Volunteer supervisors? Decorations? Equipment? A rain-out option? What is your plan for food and drinks?



6. Promote your party! Let's talk promotion – after all, you want people to show up! Chances are that your neighbours were made aware of the party when you petitioned to them earlier. But have you updated them with a date, time, and location? Consider making a flyer to pass around door-to-door! Social media is also a great free tool to spread the word. Consider partnering up with your local community association to help spread the word! They might also have some resources or tips and tricks to help you throw the best block party possible.

*Note that some grants require partnership with insured organizations (e.g., community associations) to receive funding.

7. Have fun!

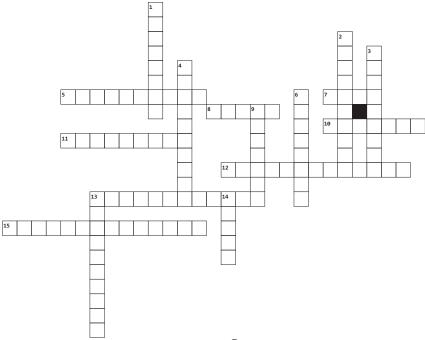
